REPORT BY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF DEVELOPMENT AND ENVIRONMENT TO THE REGULATORY PANEL OF 25th NOVEMBER 2010

**SUBJECT: SOUTH AYRSHIRE COUNCIL (Disabled Persons' Parking Places)
ORDER 2010.**

1. Purpose.

The purpose of this report is to seek formal approval to make an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, namely, "South Ayrshire Council (Disabled Persons' Parking Places) Order 2010".

2. Recommendation.

It is recommended that the Panel give approval to make the above named Traffic Regulation Order.

3. Background.

The Disabled Persons' Parking Places (Scotland) Act 2009 came into effect on 1st October 2009. This Act places duties on the Council to promote proper use of parking places for disabled persons' vehicles. The Act requires the Council to promote Traffic Regulation Orders to enable disabled parking bays to be enforceable.

4. Consideration.

Officers have begun to establish and reassess the need for each disabled parking place in South Ayrshire. There are an estimated 200 disabled parking bays on-road within South Ayrshire. To date 97 disabled parking places have been assessed and the statutory consultation completed to enable them to be included in the "South Ayrshire Council (Disabled Persons' Parking Places) Order 2010".

The remaining on-road disabled persons' parking places will be assessed during the coming year (2011) and Traffic Regulation Orders promoted to cover the qualifying bays.

Table 4.1 lists the locations of the Disabled Persons' Parking Places, which are regulated by the "South Ayrshire Council (Disabled Persons' Parking Places) Order 2010".
